Last Sunday - Sunday School Picnic!

Pastor Joseph preached "Don't Leave The Ship" using Acts 27. The main point of the message was for us to stay faithful to God and the Church during the storms of life, and to trust the voice of God above man's "wisdom." The Book of Acts tells of Paul's fateful voyages to Rome by ship. On a certain part of the journey, a terrible doom awaited them if they sailed at a certain time. God forewarned Paul, and he forewarned the Roman soldiers to whom he was chained, but they refused to listen to the man of God, choosing instead to trust in the human wisdom of the "expert" sailors into whose hands they committed their lives. When the storm came, it was so severe and lasted so long, they all despaired for their lives, and the wimpled "expert" sailors wanted to abandon ship in a lifeboat and leave the soldiers and others to die. But God's angel had stood by Paul the previous night and told him that unless everyone stayed on board the ship, all would be lost. God's messenger conveyed that if everyone displayed faith in God by staying on board, everyone would survive. Thus God's "I told you so" was wrapped with grace and mercy. Sometimes people suffer shipwreck (so to speak) in their life because of their own mistakes. The worst thing to do then is blame God or the Church. But it is even easier to be tempted to blame God or the Church when you go through storms and trials that are not your fault. However, even then we must trust God and stay faithful to the Church. Like Paul, who was dragged into the storm against his will and against his better judgment, sometimes we suffer trials in life not because of our lack of wisdom, but because of the people we are chained to, whether emotionally, or relationally, or otherwise. Still trust in God!

Wednesday

Pastor Joseph preached "New Ground" which was based upon (and was a continuation of) the theme of the recent North American Youth Congress, "Go Beyond." If some new thing you are trying is sinful, then you are damaging yourself in ways that will have lasting impact. If some new thing is not sinful, you might encounter some problems because of mistakes due to inexperience, but at least you are treading new ground. We all ought to have times in our life when we make mistakes because we're trying something we've never done before. It's cheap and easy for those who are unwilling to try anything new to sit in their ruts and criticize we who are treading new territory (pointing out the mistakes we are making that are caused by doing something new in God). The biblical concept of freedom is **not** liberty to try the sinful things one's carnal nature wants to try, but rather freedom from one's carnal nature, releasing one to actually follow God in righteousness and holiness, doing those good things and living that holy lifestyle that one's carnal nature would normally prohibit us from attaining. A blind person, while walking in his or her own strength, can only tread familiar territory. It takes outside help for him or her to go somewhere new. The most awesome new territory for us to tread is to live a life of truly loving one another. By this

shall all men know that we are His!
