### Last Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph began a series called "The Doctrine of the Last Things" (about the End Time). Biblical definitions were given for heaven, hell, the New Jerusalem, the new heaven, paradise, etc. Both Old Testament and New Testament references were given regarding hell, including study of the Hebrew word *sheol*, and the Greek words *hades*, gehenna, and tartarus. We studied interesting teachings of Jesus about the abode of the dead (Luke 16) and the lake of fire (see Mark 9:42-48; Mat. 13:42, 50). It seems defensible that perhaps Jesus led righteous souls from hades (the paradise side) into the immediate presence of God as part of His triumph over death (Eph. 4:8-10; Heb. 2:14-15). Righteous souls are now in the immediate presence of God (II Cor. 5:8; Phil. 1:21-24). All souls await a resurrection, the reuniting of soul and body. We studied the eternal destinies of the unrighteous and the righteous, and looked into the signs of the End Time found in the discourse of Jesus (Mat. 24:3-39; Luke 21:7-28)-false Christs, wars, rumors of wars, famines, pestilence, earthquakes, persecution, false prophets, falling away, universal preaching of gospel, tribulation, preoccupation with worldly pleasures, signs in heaven (sun, moon, and stars), perplexity of nations, people's hearts failing for fear, restoration of Jerusalem to Jewish rule. No one knows when the Lord will return (Mark 13:32), but we're seeing an increase of the signs. How much more can they increase?

## Sunday PM

Pastor Joseph preached "The Crown of Life" from James 1:1-22. From v.13 we see that God never tempts anyone with evil (never does anything to incite lust or lead to sin). However, God does "tempt" (prove) His people in the sense of testing us to bring experience, causing confidence in God and in ourselves. That is the meaning of "God did tempt Abraham" (Gen. 22:1). By contrast, the devil does tempt people with evil. Yet the worst temptations we face come not from Satan but from our own flesh (our carnal nature). Each of us is his/her own worst enemy. James wrote, "every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed" (v.14). He showed that giving in to such temptations leads to sin, which leads to death. Yet there is good news for those who endure without giving in: "Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him" (v.12). The beauty of earning a crown of life is that one day we will have that crown to throw at Jesus' feet, for He bought for us what we could never earn or buy; eternal life.

### Wednesday

Pastor Joseph preached on eternal life using John 3:16 as his text. The gospel writer, John, recorded many wonderful promises of the Lord to us as believers. Some of these promises are things which "shall" happen, but seven of them are things which "shall not" happen to us. Regarding the indwelling Holy Ghost, Jesus said, "Whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life" (4:14). Likewise, "Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst" (6:35). He also taught: "I am the light of life" (8:12). *Our deepest needs are met in Him*. Once we have believed and are converted, we are placed into His family and He promises to us, "I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand" (10:28). And "He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into

condemnation; but is passed from death unto life" (5:24). Believers should have no fear of death. "I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die..." (11:25-26).
