Sunday AM, August 5

On our special Biker Sunday at the conclusion of the Azusa StreetRiders National Rally, Pastor Joseph preached "Portable Church" using John 1:14 as his text. In the Old Testament period, the Tabernacle ("Mishkan") in the Wilderness was a portable church tent, a place of intersection between God and men. It served as a focal point for worship, and was literally a place where the Lord had placed His name! His anointing dwelt there. The Hebrew word for Tabernacle was Mishkan also used to describe the Presence of God dwelling among His people. John 1:14 says "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us...." The Greek word translated "dwelt among us" is Skenoo, which means "to tent, dwell, encamp, to reside (as God did in the Tabernacle of old, a symbol of protection and communion)." It is related to the Hebrew word, Mishkan, and literally means 'tabernacled among us' or 'pitched his tent among us.' Pastor Joseph showed illustrations of the Tabernacle, and a synagogue frieze carving by a clever Byzantine era (4th century) artist who imagined a church on wheels! The artist blended the stately appearance of Herod's temple with the portability of the Tabernacle in the wilderness! The concept of a portable church was what God had in mind all the time. Your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost! We not only need to "come" to church, but everywhere we go, we ought to be the portable church!

Sunday PM, August 5

Bro. Jim Curley (ASR from Kentucky, near Huntington, WV) preached from Mark 16:20. We need to focus our hearts and thought-life on God and His word. If we feed our thought-life on worldly music, carnal entertainment, and drama, then wickedness and carnality will be what comes forth from us. "Garbage in; garbage out." Listening to worldly music will have a negative impact on our spirituality. We need godly music. We need a prayer life. We need to study and soak in the Word of God. Such is the kind of lifestyle that will help us to be an overcomer as well as a good witness for the Kingdom of God. We need to be careful about what we watch or listen to. It's time to get serious about living for God!

Wednesday, August 8

Elder Lorren Godwin preached from Mark 5:1-20 and John 4:4-30. In Mark, there was never an argument from the demonic spirits about if they were going to leave or not. They asked when, not if. The importance of the possessed man's past takes a backseat to who he became after meeting Jesus. Questions of his past never arose. Jesus doesn't call the qualified; he qualifies the called. All the Lord was concerned with was that he had something to work with. In John, Jesus knew she was a Samaritan. He knew what time she would get to the well. He sent his disciples into the city to teach them a lesson about themselves. The disciples, who had travelled with Jesus, went into town for lunch. Twelve in, twelve out. She spent a short amount of time with Jesus and brought the whole city back with her.




