#### Last Sunday AM

Rev. Phillip Zook preached "Do You Know What You Worship?" from John 4:22. Just as the Samaritan woman that the Lord met at the well had her understanding of Him transformed, we also need to undergo a transformation of at least three key aspects that affect our knowledge of the Lord: perception, proximity, and priority. Your perception will dictate how you worship. How do you perceive God? We all must undergo a perception change. We are not to worship a crucifix, a building, or a statute. The woman said, "I perceive that thou art a prophet." Jesus replied, "If you knew..." We can perceive better when we are closer to God (spiritually). Physical location doesn't matter, but rather where you are in relationship to God. After your perception change you need a proximity change. But all of this is a question of priority. Jesus went to Samaria for only **one** person. His disciples went to town for food and brought no one back with them. The woman went and brought the whole city back to Jesus! She experienced a change in her priorities! We also should have a burning desire to bring people to know who Jesus is.

Rev. Phillip Zook preached "The Ghost and The Darkness" from I Peter 5:8. The Tsavo Man-Eaters were a pair of notorious man-eating lions responsible for the deaths of a number of construction workers on the Kenya-Uganda Railway from March through December, 1898. One of the man-eaters was called "The Ghost" and the other was called "The Darkness." The Bible says, "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour." Satan is your adversary; not your pastor or any other brother or sister in Christ. We ought to focus on who the real enemy is, not attack each other. Lt. Col. John Henry Patterson, the construction project leader, tried to trap the lions to no avail. Nothing blocked, stopped, or caught them. Eventually he simply had to hunt and kill them. One of them was over 9½ feet from nose to tip of tail. When it comes to the devil's attempts to take us out spiritually, we simply must hunt and destroy all traces of his influence in our lives. In Christ we have victory! Jesus is the Lion of the Tribe of Judah, and He has conquered the enemy for us all!

#### Last Wednesday

Jr. Elder Zach Sandy preached from Matthew 9:20-22. The woman with the issue of blood was desperate. We all need a genuine desperation in our approach to Christ. The old-timers used to have all night prayer meetings. Where has that desperation gone? In our day and age, our faith needs to be at an all-time high. We need to push aside all distractions and have faith in God. Jesus said, "In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33). David danced before the Lord with all his might. We ought to worship that way, without it being contingent on us getting any further blessings from the Lord. He is worthy! Elder Baron Claypool preached "An Unlikely Hero" from Judges 3:1-3, 12-19. We all have ample potential excuses, but each of us must get past excuses and serve God

faithfully. This includes removing anything that God says to get rid of. For example, we need to be careful about what music we listen to, because music can be a powerful weapon toward spiritual oppression and bondage. In the text, God's people were backslidden so the Lord gave them over to their enemy. They repented, and so He sent them an unlikely hero, Ehud, who was left-handed, which was viewed as a handicap and limitation. Rather than wallow in excuses and self pity, Ehud used his "handicap" as his leverage. He was able to conceal and use a "left-handed" dagger with which to destroy Eglon, the enemy king who was oppressing God's people.
