Elder Chuck Hoskins preached on love and forgiveness, using James 5:13-16 as his text. "Is any among you afflicted? let him pray. Is any merry? let him sing psalms. Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." This noteworthy passage about the prayer of faith has much important doctrine in a small passage. Love is not an option, and forgiveness is not an option. While the Bible in other places tells that all believers are able to have faith so that their prayer brings about healing and forgiveness, this passage focuses on how the elders of the church ought to exemplify what is surely expected and attainable among all believers. We need to be honest with each other in confessing our faults, so that healing will flow in our midst.

Sister Susan Smith ministered on the topic, "My Child, I've Got This!" using Psalm 37:23-25 as her text. Surely the steps of the righteous are ordered of the Lord. It is not so much a question of whether God will provide direction, but a question of whether we will obey and walk in the direction He provides. This is the test that separates the righteous from the unrighteous. Sometimes when bad events happen, we blame God or blame ourselves, instead of realizing it might have been God's only way to get our attention, and get us moving in a different direction, obeying His word and His will in ways we never would have otherwise. "And as Jesus passed forth from thence, he saw a man, named Matthew, sitting at the receipt of custom: and he saith unto him, Follow me. And he arose, and followed him" (Matthew 9:9). Matthew followed! He obeyed! What have you been doing lately for the work of the Kingdom? Are you truly following God's will with all you are? Sometimes we get off track, and we ought to love and obey God's nudge.


Wednesday

Pastor Joseph preached on "Developing Christian Priorities in Life" using I John 2:15-17 and other verses. The life priorities of unbelievers are sorely out of balance when compared to Scripture, and ought to be dramatically different from priorities of believers. The unbeliever seeks status, wealth, power, happiness, pleasure, often at the expense of marriage, family, and certainly at the expense of eternal things. Our values are much different. Our goals are to know God better every day through personal time with Him (in prayer and in Bible study), and seeking to know and hone our spiritual gifts, using them to be profitable in the Kingdom of God. We are to be unconditionally available to God for the work of the Kingdom. If we line up with what God is doing in the earth, we will have little time left for worldly pursuits. We seek to maintain church fellowship, and to be salt and light.
