Elder Lorren Godwin preached "In Search of the Reward" from Hebrews 11:6. We must maintain a personal relationship with God, always striving to improve and become closer to Him. We must pray—talk to God as our closest friend. Read His Word and meditate on it day and night. He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. To diligently seek is to search for Him continually. True, we must daily live, but Jesus should be foremost in our minds. He should dominate our thoughts. God sets us free from the dominion of sin, not by strengthening our old man but by crucifying him. We must "die daily." We have a joy set before us that helps us endure. "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory" (II Corinthians 4:17). It is only as we are blessed and then broken that we are ready to be given.


Wednesday



Join us in the National Day of Prayer



Churches often take part in the National Day of Prayer either the Sunday before, or the Sunday afterward. CAC is honoring the event today. However, on the appointed day, Thursday, May 7, you and your family can also participate directly, in addition to the church's participation today. Whichever way you choose to take part beyond today, there is plenty to pray about. Iran is attempting to develop nuclear weapons, and has pledged to annihilate Israel and displays hatred for America. Islamic militants are murdering people across the Middle East, particiularly Christians, and their genocidal efforts are spreading to other parts of the world. Here at home Christians are being persecuted by lawsuits and by government officials on behalf of the radical homosexual agenda, and although 30 states voted to protect natural marriage as being only a union of a man and woman (with most of those states actually amending their own constitutions to do so), federal judges have overturned many of those votes, and this has led to the US Supreme Court taking up the case to rule on who gets to decide which definition of marriage will be used by any given state: will it be the people of that state? Or will everyone have a new definition forced upon us by unelected judges?
