Last Sunday AM — "Appreciation Sunday" — honoring heroes

Pastor Joseph preached "No Greater Love" from John 15:13. There are various kinds of hero, but the greatest is one who is willing to lay down his life for others. Pastor Joseph observed that the heroes in our sanctuary are those who chose to give rather than to get. He urged all the youth to consider what approach they will take in life, and urged them to defy the zeitgeist around us, to resist the spirit of the age, which is a lousy, selfish spirit that shouts deafeningly to "look out for #1" and commands us to adopt a thug's outlook of "I'm'a get mine!" He urged us all to give, rather than choosing to get. Jesus is the most genuine of heroes. He died for you! He was resurrected, proving power over death, to illustrate that eternal life is open for you! He paid the purchase price for fallen, broken, and cursed men and women and children, to buy us back from the slaveholder known as sin. He did it for you! Let the Spirit of the risen Jesus come into your heart. Let the Hero be born in you.

Pastor Joseph preached "Precious" from Mark 14:1-9. A woman broke open her treasured alabaster box and poured precious ointment on Jesus' head. Somehow she had grasped the prophecy of His coming death and anointed him for burial. Like the alabaster box, Jesus had to be broken and sacrificed to save us. And, like an alabaster box, believers house a treasure (the Holy Ghost) in our "earthen vessels" (our bodies). "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us" (II Corinthians 4:7). Our body is the temple of the Holy Ghost. Just as Jesus blessed the bread and then broke it before giving it, we must submit to being blessed, broken, and given to be used by the Master. When we cry out to God with a sincere voice from a broken and contrite spirit it releases a precious fragrance to Him. We must let God have control of our lives and follow where He leads. From within us should come forth precious things such as love, joy, peace, goodness, etc.

Sis. Adena Joseph spoke from Esther 1:10-12. Imagine what would have happened if Esther had given in to fear instead of protesting the slaughter of her people! We are so thankful that she listened to God.

Paul and Silas were thrown in jail and shackled because they were doing God's will, yet they didn't give up. They prayed and sang praises to God! Suddenly there was an earthquake that freed them and others. Through everything you suffer, you can choose to give up or you can choose to be an earth shaker. Pray, go to church even when you don't feel like it. Keep striving to get closer and seek the face of God. Be the one who makes a difference wherever you are.

Pastor Joseph and CAC honored at WV For Life's annual Rose Dinner



Jewels Green, guest speaker at last night's annual WV For Life Rose Dinner, spoke powerfully, moving us to tears. She is a former pro-abortion feminist, who while she was young, had an abortion forced upon her against her will, resulting in a depression that led to suicide attempts. Afterward, to try convince herself that she had done no wrong, she worked for years inside abortion clinics. During that time, she denied her own heart while at times helping to count the body parts of murdered babies. When faced with nightmares, she inquired from a superior if others did also. She commended the honesty of the answer: she was told in calm tones. "What we do here is end a life. If you are not OK with that, then you cannot work here." She remained employed there for more years, before eventually being horrified at a friend who (as a surrogate mother) was paid thousands of dollars to kill off the baby after genetics testing revealed Down's Syndrome. She recoiled at what was obviously a "mob-style hit." She went on to realize she could not call that abortion wrong without admitting all of them were.
