Elder Lorren Godwin preached "Love Not The World" from Colossians 3:1-2. We are allowed to be blessed and have nice things but remember these things are temporary. We must not get too comfortable with the world or it will sneak in on us. Pleasures of this life will start to feel like *this is ok* or *that won't hurt us*. We must be very careful. Spend more time in prayer. Attending church and coming together in unison is required so we won't become numb to sins of this world. When we don't fellowship, things of the world will creep in. We must not get all wrapped up in the things of this world. But rather, we should keep our minds in heavenly places. "Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth" (Colossians 3:2). Personal update from Bishop David Hudson



We have done 13 treatments since we have been here and have seen favorable results. The only side effect that I am challenged with is constipation, and I had that before I came. It comes from the morphine medication that I've been taking. Certainly a challenge to say the least. We are scheduled to return back to WV next Saturday, the 20th.

Without any question we feel it has been the right thing for us to make this journey. We have been able to determine the challenge that Sister Hudson has had with mini-strokes that did not show up in earlier testing in Morgantown. After much testing it has been determined that everything has been coming from too much stress. She certainly has had her share of it, which of course makes me feel badly, as I know I have been the source of that stress.

We are still doing our best to press forward, trusting and believing God, and depending upon the prayers of the faithful and righteous. The only thing we know is that God knows all things. He is the potter and we are the clay. Your continued prayer means everything to us. Thank you is such a simple word but it conveys our most heartfelt feelings toward each of you and your family. Only God knows what is good for us but we will continue to do our best.
